




## WHAT IS SCIENCE4FUN ABOUT?


Science4Fun is innovative in developing new model of training for the teaching of science that emphasises real world application and practical experiments. Science4Fun is enabling partners to meet new needs and demands of students and trainers who are preparing for a technical and scientific future.

The focus of the project is to resolve the problem of the willingness of young people to become more engaged with science. Currently disengagement exacerbates the issues, moreover the output of our education systems do not correlate well with the expectations of the labour market. One of the steps is also promoting new methodological approach in order to increase motivation of students. It encourages an interesting way of teaching science, specifically in aspects of physics, chemistry, geology, biology, astronomy and environmental resources.



# STAFF TRAINING, JULY 2019:

- Understanding the science taxonomy data model of the project and how the questionnaires cover that taxonomy in the baseline test.
- Configuring the system to include my class in the baseline test the first time and the following year.
- Running the baseline test and analyzing the results.
- How to feed the guidance system and the teachers in-service, following the taxonomy (indexing resources) to propose relevant resources depending on the Baseline Test results.
- How to work with the project resources and create them.
